<b>Level 4 Expanding</b>	<b>The student will be able to:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> retell narrative stories through pictures with emerging detail.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> sing repetitive songs and chants independently.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> compare attributes of real objects (e.g., size, shape, color).</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> indicate spatial relations of real-life objects using phrases or short sentences.</li> </ul>
<b>Level 3 Developing</b>	<b>The student will be able to:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> retell short narrative stories through pictures.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> repeat sentences from rhymes and patterned stories.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> make predictions (e.g. "What will happen next?").</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> answer explicit questions from stories read aloud (e.g., who, what, or where).</li> </ul>
<b>Level 2 Beginning</b>	<b>The student will be able to:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> restate some facts from illustrated short stories.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> describe pictures, classroom objects or familiar people using simple phrases.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> answer questions with one or two words (e.g., "Where is Sonia?").</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> complete phrases in rhymes, songs, and chants.</li> </ul>
<b>Level 1 Entering</b>	<b>The student will be able to:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> identify people or objects in illustrated short stories.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> repeat words, simple phrases.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> answer yes/no questions about personal information.</li> <li><input type="checkbox"/> name classroom and everyday objects.</li> </ul>
