## The Learning Commons & Cyber Hub

The Legacy Learning Commons is hard at work delivering all types of media for the students and staff. One of the many highlights for this year is the addition of "The Cyber Hub". This room, located just off of the Market Place, is designed to allow our Saber Cyber students to support the Bismarck Public Schools IT department by learning how to assist the student population with their technological needs. You will see students learning about and actively servicing Chromebooks as you have in years past in this new location.

Something else exciting to share about "The Cyber Hub" space is that it will help to support the

Maker Space trend that is sweeping the nation. A Maker Space is a place where students can come and use inquiry skills to create and make materials of their own intellectual design. Within these spaces, it is common to see items such as STEM based activities (Aduino's, Raspberry Pi's, Spheros, Makey Makey's) and cultural based activities such as the arts and music be fulfilled at the wishes of the students.

Although it is under construction, in the very near future, a LEGO wall will be added to the space to bolster creativity for students during their off mods, providing a constructive space for collaboration and communi-

cation. Likewise, plans for the room will include a green screen to allow students a location to expand video based projects, a recording area for potential podcasts, and even an arcade, made by a student at Legacy. There will also be a performance space for students hoping to perform original works, or their own artistic expressions of today's pop culture.

The sky is the limit for this space, and so far the amount of work and production coming from the room has been positive. Students have their say in
