



These guidelines align with CDC and ND Dept. of Health requirements.

Quarantine recommendations will be made on a case-by-case basis in consultation with BBPH in an attempt to keep the school open and operational.

<p>Any person who has tested positive for COVID-19.</p> <p>With symptoms:</p> <p>Isolation until the following requirements have been met:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * 10 days since symptoms first appeared AND * 24 hours since last fever (without the use of fever reducing medication) AND * Symptoms have improved <p>The 24 hours without fever may possibly occur within the 10 days of isolation or after the 10 days.</p> <p>Without symptoms (asymptomatic):</p> <p>Isolate for 10 days from the date of first positive test:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Monitor self for symptoms, take temperature twice daily * Released from isolation after 10 days have passed as long as no symptoms 	<p>Any person who lives in the same household with Person A</p> <p>No symptoms (monitor for 14 days):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Quarantine immediately * Quarantine while Person A is ill and/or isolated * Quarantine an additional 10 days after Person A has recovered and been released from isolation * Quarantine may end after 7 days past Person A's isolation if a negative test on or after day 5. <p>*If symptomatic, quarantine is full 14 days</p>	<p>Any person with close contact to Person A (>15 min and <6 ft)</p> <p>Quarantine for 10 days following date of last exposure if no symptoms*</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Monitor self for symptoms, take temperature twice a day for 14 days * If symptoms develop, notify Primary Care Provider * Quarantine may be shortened to 7 days if testing negative on or after day 5 (returning on day 8) 	<p>Any person who has had exposure to Person B or C before quarantine</p> <p>NO QUARANTINE OR ACTION REQUIRED unless:</p> <p>Person B or C develops symptoms OR tests positive and Person D had contact within 14 days, then:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Monitor self for symptoms, take temperature twice a day * Contact Health Department with any questions and further instructions * Contact Primary Care Provider
 <h2>Recovered and Released</h2>			
<p>Definitions:</p> <p>Close contact is defined as anyone who was within 6 feet of an infected person for at least a cumulative 15 minutes starting from 48 hours prior to the person having symptoms. <i>*See Close Contact and Face Covering Guidelines.</i></p> <p>Isolation separates infected individuals with a contagious disease from people who are not sick.</p> <p>Quarantine separates and restricts the movement of a person exposed to a contagious disease to monitor if they become ill.</p> <p>Insignificant exposure is contact with an infected individual for less than 15 minutes at a distance of over or equal to 6 feet.</p> <p>For more information, contact Bismarck/Burleigh Public Health or the ND Dept. of Health.</p>
