

Guidelines for Students Transferring to Alternative School

Students who wish to enroll at South Central High School must apply for admission to the principal at South Central High School. In order to be accepted, the applicant must be at least 16 years of age and not over 21 years of age unless an exception is approved by the Superintendent.

Students who qualify for the JTPA program or other programs approved by the Bismarck School District may enroll in South Central High School in accord with program eligibility requirements. If a student qualifying under such an approved program is younger than 16, an exception to the minimum age requirement may be approved on an individual basis by a committee consisting of the principal and a counselor from the appropriate senior high school, the principal and a counselor from South Central High School, and the student's parents.

Students attending South Central High School will receive a diploma from South Central High School. Transferring to SCHS generally shall not be used as a method to graduate early. Unless otherwise approved by the Superintendent. SCHS students will graduate from SCHS at the same time as, or when academically necessary later than, they were originally scheduled to graduate from high school.
