

Career and Technical Education

The Bismarck School Board believes career and technical education is an essential part of a comprehensive educational system. Such courses and program shall take into account current technological and economic conditions. The Superintendent shall ensure that all students have access to career education suited for their age and grade level.

The Board shall cooperate with the State Board for Career and Technical Education and the Department of Public Instruction in the establishment and maintenance of such programs.

Career and Technical course programs of study may integrate job shadowing, internships, or paid work experiences in a related field where students can apply their skills. The Superintendent or designee, with the advice of the instructor, shall pre-approve services to be performed. This shall apply whether the work to be done is for the school, a private individual, a business, or a civic or charitable organization.

Advisory committees made up of business and industry employers serve as advisors to CTE teachers to ensure that curriculum and instruction are relevant, current, and reflect changing technologies and knowledge.
